The shared vision for the SBCHH is to:

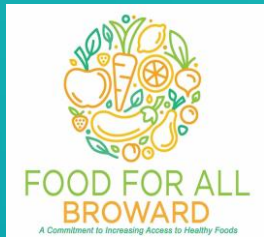
<b>Coordinate</b>	community-driven and equitable food and health access activities, services, and opportunities

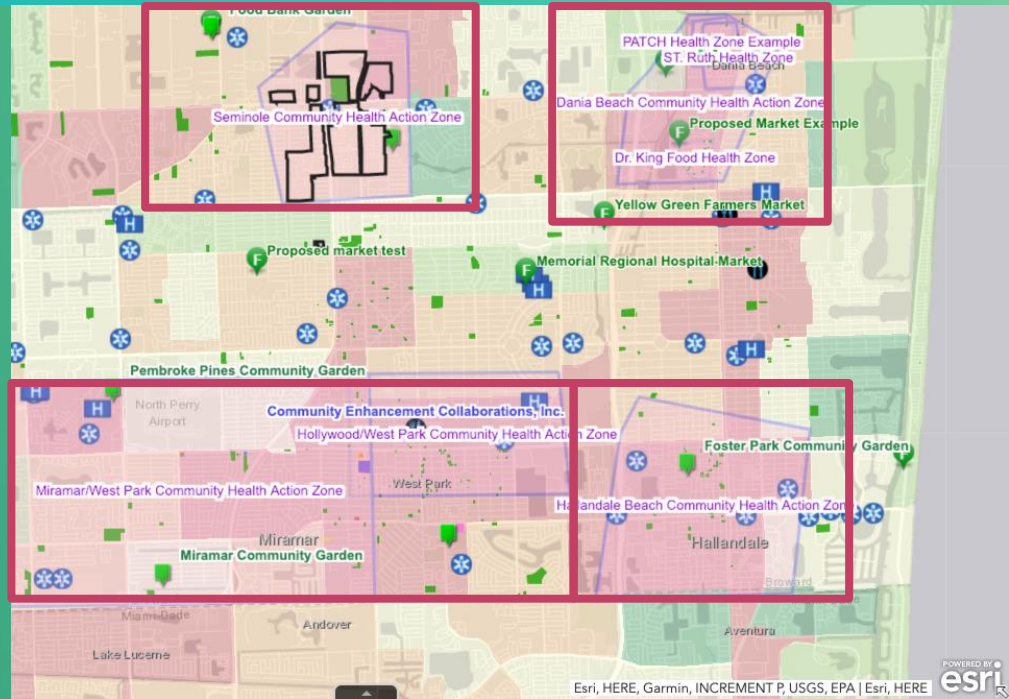

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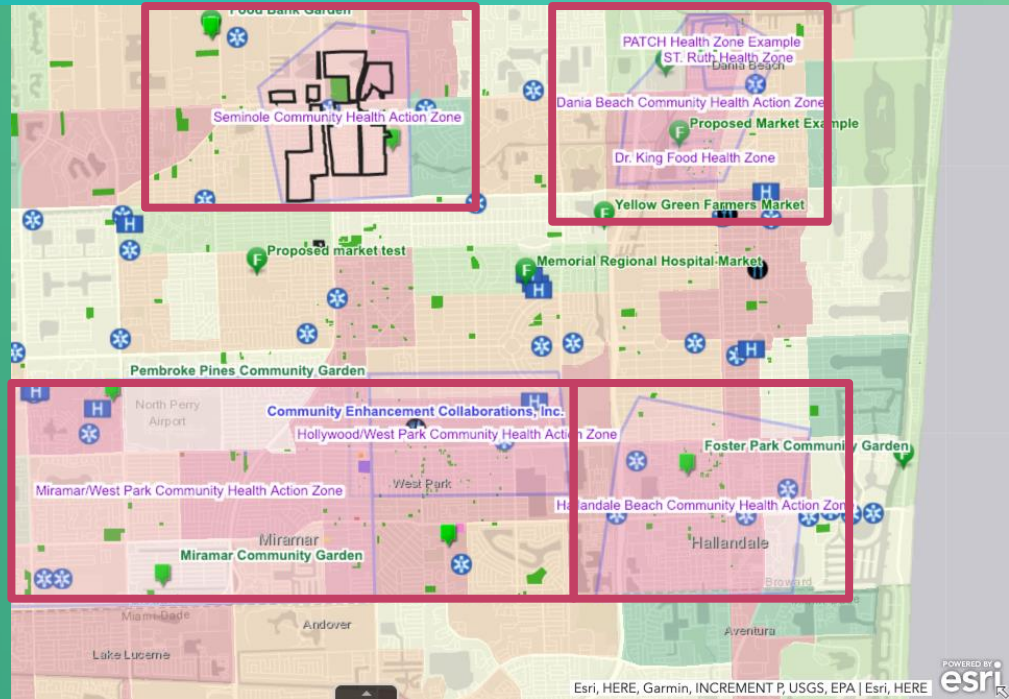
