## Round 1 Blooming Solution: The Faith, Food and Health Access Network (FFHAN)

LEAD: Be the Drop Foundation, Inc.

LOCATION: City of Miramar and south Broward

GOAL: Establish a network of local faith-leaders to help support their food distribution and food and health access efforts.

ACCOMPLISHMENTS TO DATE:

- Reach: 30+ Faith-Based Leaders Outreached
- Activities: Conducted 1 Kickoff Meeting (13 attendees) and hosted the National Day of Prayer Faith Leaders Brunch (25 attendees)
- Sustainability: Collaborated in Round 2 mini-grant application to expand reach and connections in support of the FFHAN leaders and efforts.



## Round 1 Blooming Solution: Fresh Success Mobile Markets

LEADS: The Dania Beach PATCH & Community Enhancement Collaboration, Inc.

LOCATION: City of Hollywood/Washington Park

GOAL: Facilitate 10 Fresh Success Mobile Markets to complement food distribution, pantry, and other health related activities by providing affordable local produce and healthy cooking and eating education.

ACCOMPLISHMENTS TO DATE:

- Reach: 120 CEC participants outreached
- Activities: Conducted 1 Fresh Success Mobile Market (xx attendees) and scheduled the 2<sup>nd</sup> Fresh Success Mobile Market for August
- Sustainability: Collaborating with Round 1 and 2 mini-grant partners to to expand the Fresh Success Markets and related activities.



## Round 1 Blooming Solution: Food Access and Community Empowerment Solutions (FACES)

LEAD: St. Ruth Missionary Baptist Church

LOCATION: City of Dania Beach

GOAL: Build and develop a system to program a shared storage space to serve food distribution needs in the community.

ACCOMPLISHMENTS TO DATE:

- Activities: Consulted with a contractor, worked with shed-builder, in the process of acquiring a city permit to begin construction.
- Sustainability: Collaborating with Round 2 mini-grant partners to implement programming to activate the shared storage space and other resource connections in the City of Dania Beach through FACES 2



# Round 2 Blooming Solution: Eco-Connections

LEADS: Renüable and Resorcity

LOCATION: South Broward

GOAL: Through Resorcity's existing platform co-design updates to serve both individual and collective marketing, promotion, and community-connection needs of diverse equity and ecologically-minded businesses and nonprofits through Renüable and the SBCHH networks.

LEAD: Florida Rising

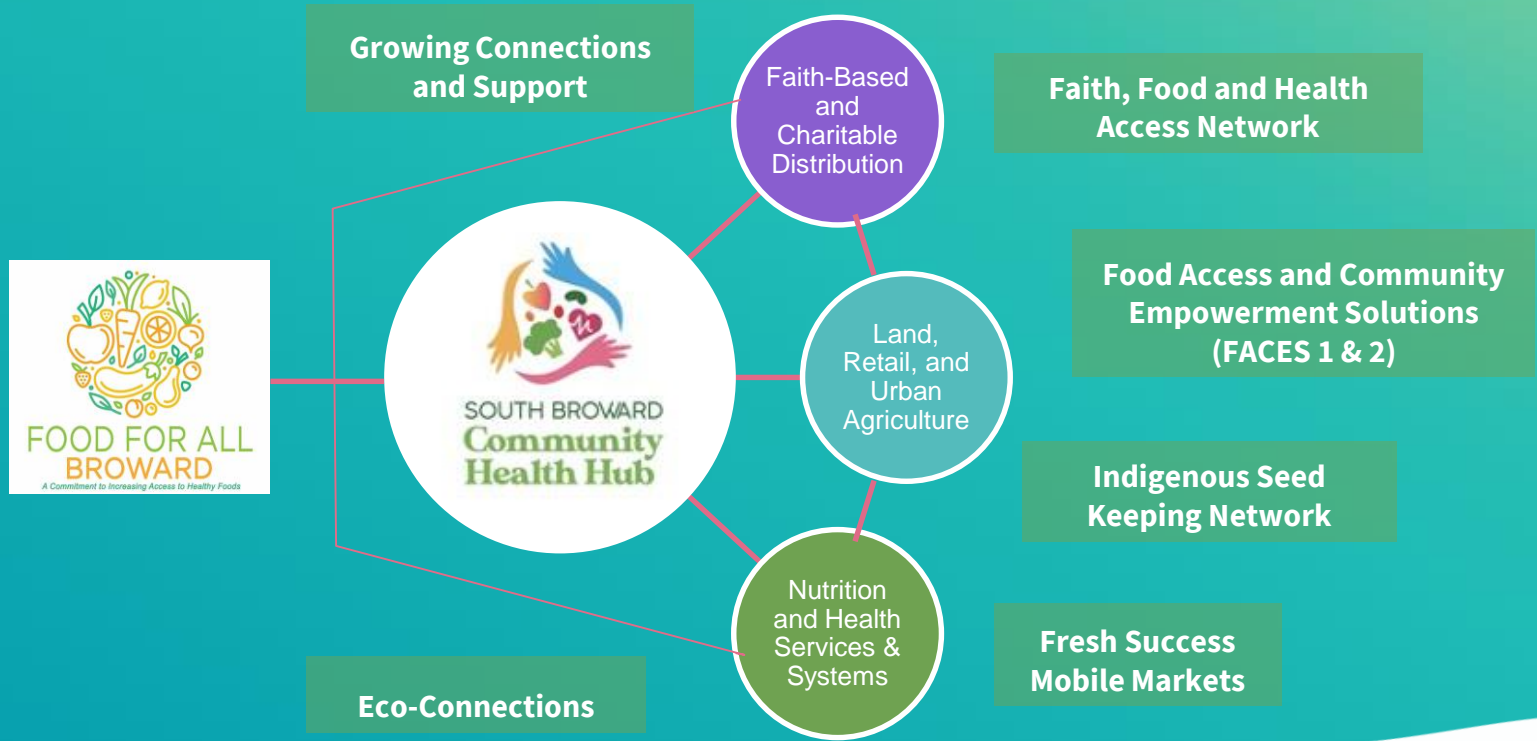

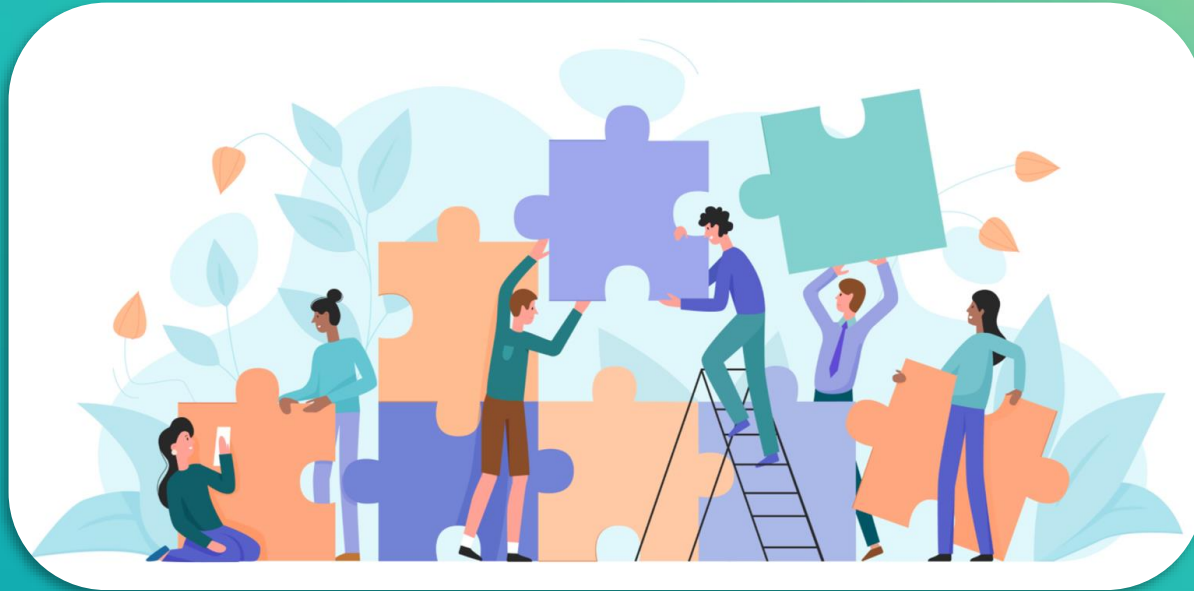

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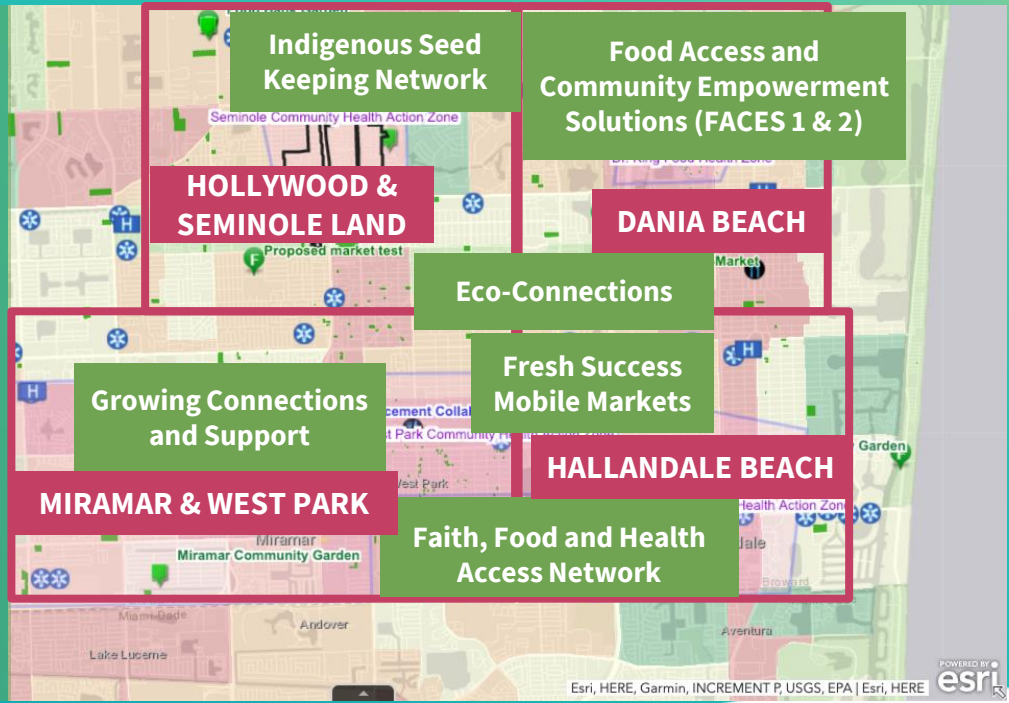
